There are many reasons why the Cuban youth is honoring the prestigious writer, researcher and journalist Marta Rojas, National Journalism prizewinner; the famous musician, scriptwriter, director, speaker, actor ... Iván Pérez, National Radio Prizewinner; the outstanding and popular actress and teacher Corina Mestre, National Artistic Teaching Prizewinner; the indispensable plastic artist and Artistic Merit Diploma of the Higher Art Institute, Flora Fong; and the director, record producer, arranger, luxury composer, Joaquín Betancourt.

The ceremony will take place at the José Martí Memorial, at 4 pm as part of the celebration of the AHS National Council.

This distinction is the top recognition granted by the organization of the young artistic leadership to the creative and pedagogical work carried out by important personalities of culture and thinking.
